# **CAPACITY BUILDING PROJECTS**

#### Social Media Ninja

With the help of an RDN Northern Economic Development grant the workshop was offered at a very low cost to participants. We then teamed up businesses with KSS high school students to assist with executing their social media strategy. Students received volunteer hours for time spent assisting the businesses.

The QBCOC staffs and houses the Visitor Centre and this year we greeted over 10,000 visitors from May through August 2018 alone. There were five consecutive days late August when we spoke with 1000 people! #### **Town Summer Transit Initiative**

This summer the QBCOC assisted the Qualicum Beach Town Council through advertising and marketing efforts to encourage ridership on the new transit initiative to cover the cost of all fares for service on the Route 97 Eaglecrest and Route 98 Qualicum Beach.

The initiative was aimed at increasing ridership, reducing traffic and parking congestion, improving safety, and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
